In around 1815, a map of the landholdings in the town was produced by surveyor William Downes. The map is accompanied with a bound book inscribed on the cover as belonging to the Workhouse Court. The book is headed 1814 - 1815.

NOTES

The Jones family influence over Sudbury began from, Joseph Jones who in 1801 owned the Plough public house. William Jones, described himself, in his will in 1814, as 'common brewer, merchant and farmer'. He owned the Lion, the Greyhound and the site of the Maldon Grey, a big malting premises with yards in Wiggen End. He is assumed to have been living at No.2 King Street. his property stretched beyond the Borough into Lindsey, Monks Eleigh, Melford, Acton, the Cornards, Alpheton, Shimpling, Belchamps, Foxearth, Borley, Middleton, Henney and Bures. As he had no son, his properties were shared among his nephews and nieces.

John Daking, in 1797 had a prosperous tanning business in Cross Street which probably provided the capital for the family to invest in land. Mr R Daking was later described as owner of several blocks of undeveloped land on the south-east of Town.
